

**How was the meeting advertised and what was discussed?** On village notice boards and Facebook one week before with a reminder on the day. There were some comments before the meeting concerning restarting the Youth Club, to be discussed next meeting.

**Question at the meeting:** Where does the money come from and what if we make a profit? After the programme was agreed in July, applications were made to BDT and BCC and will apply to Carrick Futures in 2023. All funding requests were granted. Fundraising in 2022 will achieve up to £1,000 and the costs of the 2022 programme is £6,000 before any additional events are requested. It is expected that in each year costs will be much higher than funds raised so a profit is not anticipated. In addition, generally the BDT agree to use of the hall without cost to the community for these events.
